TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS

- Large Screen behind the orchestra
- 1 Sound Monitor for the Singer and Narrators
- 1 Video Monitor for the Singer and Narrators
- Guitar to be run through the sound system
- Indigenous Flute to be run through the sound system
- The video show runs from QLab on a Mac.
- The Mac has a USB-C out, and USB-C to HDMI converter that can connect to an HDMI cable to run to the projector input.

• Most of the video cues also have audio running from the 1/8" headphone jack on a Mac into the soundboard.

ABOUT THE TEAM



Samantha Whelan Kotkas M. Music, B. Music - Writer/Producer

Born in Canada, raised in Africa and educated in Calgary and Houston, Samantha has been praised for creating truly unique and totally engaging experiences for audiences.

Samantha's energy, extensive education, musicianship and understanding of multi-

disciplinary performance make her stand out as one of Canada's top performers.

As a musician and storyteller she has a gift for pairing music and story to create memorable and magical experiences. She has performed her works with many of Canada's major orchestras including the Calgary Philharmonic, Edmonton Symphony Orchestra, Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra, Vancouver Symphony Orchestra and Canada's top jazz musicians. As a trumpet player, she is also a full-time member of Rosa Barocca, the Red Deer Symphony, and Altius Brass.

Samantha is the education advisor for Calgary Pro Musica and a teaching artist for the National Arts Centre of Canada (NAC) where she finds the cross-cultural work she has done, as part of the Arts Alive Program, very meaningful.



Chris Andrew - Composer/Music Director

There are very few hats that Chris Andrew doesn't wear. As one of Canada's finest pianists, Chris brings ingenuity, highly acclaimed technical abilities and passionate performances to the musical table, making it a table other musicians want to join.

He was also awarded the Galaxie Rising Star Award at Canada's 2008 National Jazz Awards.



Claude Lapalme - Orchestrator/ Conductor

Since his appointment as Music Director of the Red Deer Symphony Orchestra in 1990, Claude Lapalme has made his mark as a superb conductor, an exceptional arranger and an outstanding Music Director. His orchestrations have been called "gorgeous" and "spine-chilling."



Sherryl Sewepagaham - Composer

Sherryl Sewepagaham is of Cree-Dene ancestry from the Little Red River Cree Nation in northern Alberta. She holds a Bachelor of Music Therapy (Capilano University) and a Bachelor of Education (University of Alberta). Having taught elementary music for 14 years in Edmonton, Sherryl is an experienced elementary Music Educator focusing on Indigenous Music Education and drum songs for the classroom. Now as an emerging Music

Therapist, she will begin her work in Early Education and Attachment Disorders in the music therapy field.

Sherryl is also a 20-year member of the 2005 Juno-nominated, Edmonton-based trio Asani and composes drum songs in the Cree language. Asani received a 2010 Canadian Folk Music Award, a 2010 Indian Summer Music Award, a 2005 Canadian Aboriginal Music Award, and many other music awards nominations. Asani toured extensively around the world performing at Carnegie Hall in New York, The Kennedy Centre in Washington D.C., and the 2010 Olympics in Vancouver BC.

Sherryl is also a composer of traditional and contemporary First Nations drum songs. Her 2014 debut solo album, Splashing the Water Loudly, received a 2015 Indigenous Music Award nomination and is featured in APTN's Chaos and Courage series. Sherryl wrote the music and lyrics for the National Arts Centre's Music Alive Program (MAP) song, "Music Alive", which has been shared with elementary schools across Canada. Sherryl also created and co-created three teacher resources for the MAP program and continues to develop cultural programs for music teachers.



Matt Epp - Song writer/Performer

Award-winning songwriter Matt Epp is the quintessential troubadour. Born in the Canadian Prairies, he has won the admiration and hearts of an audience that spans the globe. He sings with a tenderness that belies an honesty seldom seen, and a weighty pitch that travels right to the core. He is a rare performer with the ability to take you into his world and make you feel like, in an instant, a true friend. His knack for

transforming theaters into living rooms is almost unparalleled and has turned him into one of the country's best live acts and most valuable artistic exports.



Walter MacDonald White Bear - Storyteller for Bear/Composer

Walter MacDonald White Bear is a Cree singer-songwriter originally from the First Nation of Moose Factory, Ontario. In addition, Walter is an educator, performer and motivational speaker. He has been performing acoustic and flute music for several years. Performance highlights include The Edmonton Folk Music Festival, The Chiefs Summit with Tom Jackson, The Dream Speakers Festival, The Mountain Song Native Theater, World Indigenous Peoples Conference on Education and

more. Walter has been featured as a keynote speaker at various conferences with topics including Social Services, Justice, Education, Wellness and the Environment. His music is a reflection of his personal journey as a First Nations person in Canada. He has shared his cultural knowledge with various audiences that range from correctional services to principals, teachers and students. He then spent two year at the Dell' Arte School of Physical Theatre in Blue Lake, California. For the last twenty-six years, Dean has been delighting audiences across the globe with his buffoonery and stilt characters; his alter ego, Gustavo the Impossiblist is infamous world-wide.

Dean has performed and taught workshops all across Canada, Europe, South America, Macedonia, New Zealand, Lesotho, Japan, and the USA. He has performed with the Calgary Philharmonic Orchestra and with Cirque du Soleil at the Luminato Festival in Toronto. Dean is proud to be an instructor for the Winnipeg International Children's Festival Circus and Magic Partnership Program, and CIRQINIQ a circus arts Program for Nunavik youth, a partnership program with Cirque du Soleil and Katimavik Regional Govt.

Dean was voted one of Calgary's Top Forty Under Forty and was recently awarded the ATB Financial Healing Through the Arts Award at the Calgary Mayor's Luncheon for the Arts.



Tobias Kalden - Technical Director

Born, raised, and educated in Germany, Tobias is pursuing his path creating inimitable experiences for audiences around the world in professional audio. After touring Europe and the US as a FOH and Monitor engineer, Tobias took up new adventures on the other side of the big Pond – Canada.

He is currently the full-time front of house engineer for Juno Award Winner Colin James.

Wanting to give back to the youth, Tobias took up the opportunity of recording and mixing duties for the Alberta International Band Festival (AIBF) in 2012. In the same year he also became the Monitor and Recording engineer for the Stampede City Sessions at the Webber Academy Performance Centre in Calgary, originally aired on Shaw on Demand and now moved over to PBS.



Paul Johnston - Recording Engineer

Ottawa-born Johnston studied piano into his teens when he switched his focus to electric bass and playing in rock bands. These days he's more likely to be seen playing acoustic bass in jazz combos around Alberta during his off-hours from Grant MacEwan University.

Studio work became a sideline after he moved to take his undergrad degree in jazz at Montreal's McGill University. It gradually became a priority, though, and he finished his master's degree in sound recording.

Paul moved to Edmonton to take his position at MacEwan in mid-2014, just in time to help plan the new studios in the downtown arts building. He has been awarded six Junos.



Lynne Huras - Visual Artist

Lynne was born and raised in the creative environment of the theatre town of Stratford, Ontario. She has, like many artists before her, found her artistic expression in the breathtaking beauty of nature. She is a graduate of the Art & Art History program at the University of Toronto/Sheridan College and, on what was to be a short stop in Banff in 1992, Lynne found endless fuel for her artistic passions in the trees, rocks and water of the Rocky Mountains.
